

INSTRUCTIONS and GUIDELINES FOR POSTER SESSION AUTHORS

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9th Annual ENETS Conference Copenhagen, 7-9 March 2012

- 1) Posters should be on A0 size paper (ca. 841 x 1,189 mm).
- 2) Posters must be designed and presented VERTICALLY. Posters designed horizontally will be disqualified from presentation.
- 3) You or your co-authors are responsible for affixing your poster to the panels provided at the conference center. Double-sided tape will be provided. Each poster panel will be labeled with a number corresponding to your abstract number in the abstract booklet to be distributed upon registration. At least one author must be present during the poster viewing to explain your work and answer questions. A major advantage of this type of presentation is interchange between investigators.
- 4) The poster should contain the title of the corresponding paper, the authors, institution and the institution's location.
- 5) Avoid color combinations which are difficult to read.
- 6) The aims of the study, the question to be asked or the hypothesis to be tested should be clearly stated in as few words as possible.
- 7) Outline your methods briefly. Provide details only for new methods or important modifications of older ones.
- 8) Results should be presented as graphs or charts. Provide a legend to explain symbols or other details. You may also want to provide an interpretation of the results below each panel.
- 9) The conclusions should be succinctly stated in large type. Many viewers read this first, hence it should be easy to understand.
- 10) Please remove your poster at the end of the conference.
